Webinar: Understanding Racial and Social Barriers to Health

Join the Cincinnati/Dayton ISCEBS chapter for our June 10th webinar "Understanding Racial and Social Barriers to Health". Our speaker is Ashley Clos with The Christ Hospital Health Network.

Health equity is achieved when every person has the opportunity to "attain his or her full health potential" and when no one is "disadvantaged from achieving this potential because of social position or other socially determined circumstances". Health inequities are reflected in differences in length of life, quality of life, rates of disease, disability, and death, severity of disease, and access to treatment.

During this program we will explore how we consider Race as a risk factor during diagnosis and treatment, how we consider a patient's Sexual Orientation and/or Gender identity during diagnosis and treatment, and how we consider a patient's "socially determined circumstances" in their care plan, along with what employers can do to improve these disparities in their benefits program and corporate culture.

As a result of attending this webinar, participants will be able to:

- Understand the social and racial barriers to healthcare that exist within an employer group
- Learn how those barriers impact access to and utilization of healthcare and care outcomes
- Identify interventions that can be incorporated into benefit and wellness plans to reduce or remove barriers and improve employee health
